DEMONSTRATION DESCRIPTIONS

- **Blacksmith:** *(Sunday only)* Christopher Magee demonstrates the time-honored skills required to turn hot metal into functional pieces.
- **Carding/Spinning/Drop Spindle:** The Spinning Study Group of Long Island show how to turn fiber into yarn. Ongoing & timed demos.
- **Greenwoodworking:** Tom Barry uses a foot-powered springpole lathe and shavehorse to shape unseasoned wood into tools and furniture.
- **Dyeing:** Adele Michelsen explains how fibers can be colorfully transformed using acid based dyes.
- **Herding:** Judianne Davis works with her border collies in a fascinating demonstration of sheep herding.
- **Needle Felting:** *(Saturday only)* Vicki Fleming demonstrates this technique of using wool to create wonderful pieces.
- **Rug Hooking:** The Peconic Ruggers practice a folk art that dates back to the Revolution. Visit them at their table in the Fiber Market.
- **Rug Braiding:** June Bassemir demonstrates this traditional craft which uses recycled strips of wool to create unique and practical floor coverings.
- **Shearing:** Tabbethia Haubold of LI Livestock Co. demonstrates shearing sheep and llamas.
- **Quilting:** The Quilt and Stitch Group of Hallockville Museum Farm demonstrates this traditional textile art and craft.
- **Weaving:** The Paumanok Weavers Guild will demonstrate this technique; Hallockville friend Judy Barth will also demonstrate in the Trubisz House.

HISTORY OF FIBER AT HALLOCKVILLE TOUR

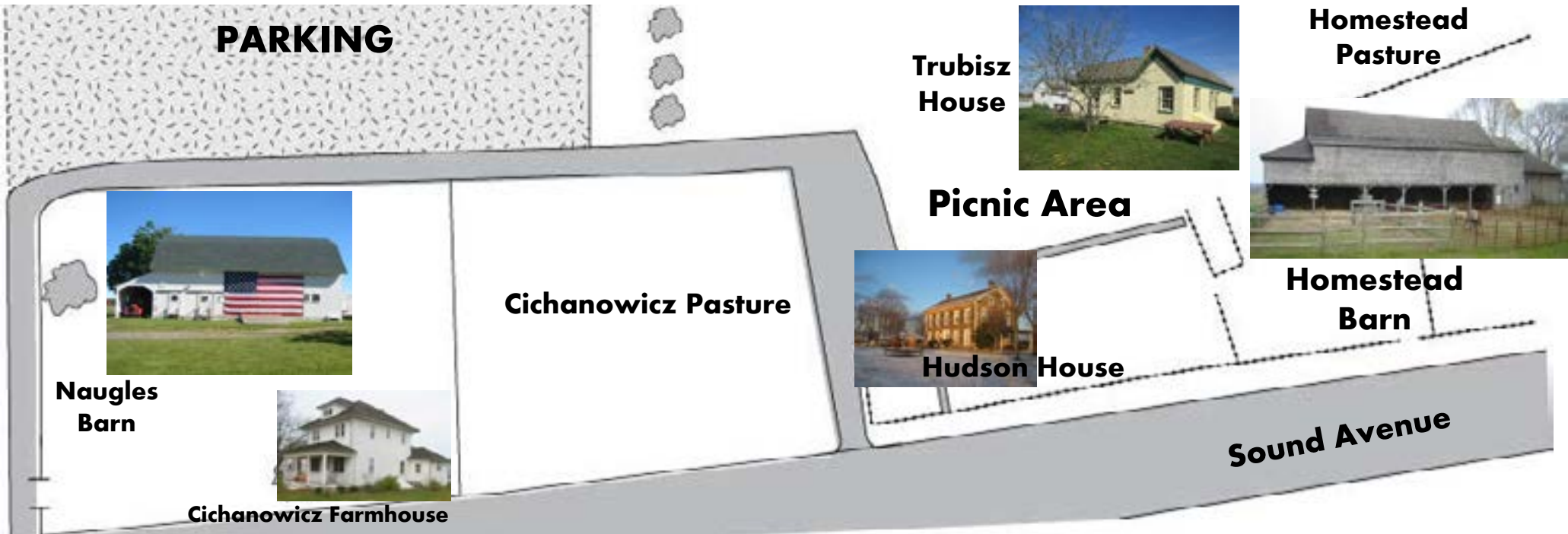
